HOW TO TAKE CARE OF A PET

1. Read the text and answer the questions.

- Why is it important to play with your pet?

Taking care of a pet can be a wonderful experience. Here are some important tips to help you keep your pet happy and healthy.

Feed your pet properly.

Pets need to be fed the right amount of food at regular times. For example, you should feed your cat twice a day. It's also important to give your pets fresh water daily.

Walk your dog regularly.

Dogs need regular walks to keep them fit and healthy. A good rule is to walk your dog twice a day, in the morning and evening. Walking also helps them to explore and stay active.

Play with your pets.

Playing with your pets keeps them happy. You can play fetch with your dog or use a laser pointer for your cat to chase. Playing every day can strengthen your bond with your pet.

Groom your pet carefully.

Grooming is important to keep your pet clean and comfortable. For instance, you should brush your rabbit's fur gently every week. This helps to remove loose fur and keeps their coat shiny.

Clean up after your pet.

It's essential to keep your pet's living area clean. For example, you should clean your hamster's cage regularly to remove any waste. This helps to prevent illnesses and keeps your pet's home fresh.
