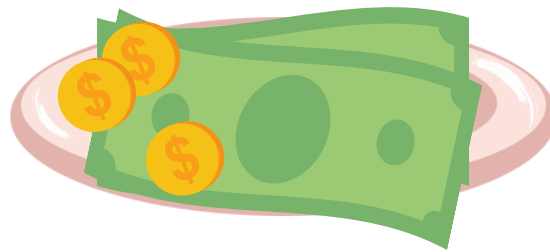

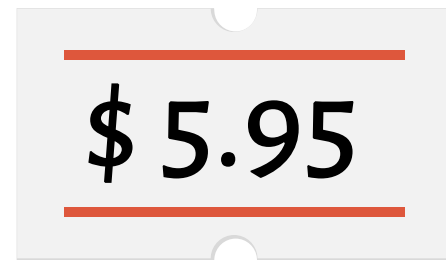

adjectives ending in CVC	big	bigger than	the biggest
short adjectives ending in -y	busy	busier than	the busiest
long adjectives (3+ syllables)	expensive	more expensive than	the most expensive
irregular adjectives	good bad far many much little	better worse farther/further* more more less + than	the best the worst the farthest/furthest* the most the most the least

*Use farther only when you are referring to distance, literal or figurative. Use further only to mean “more”.

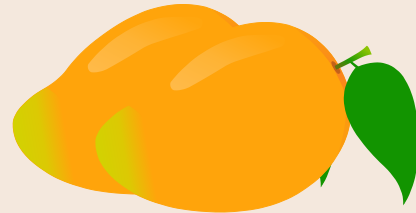

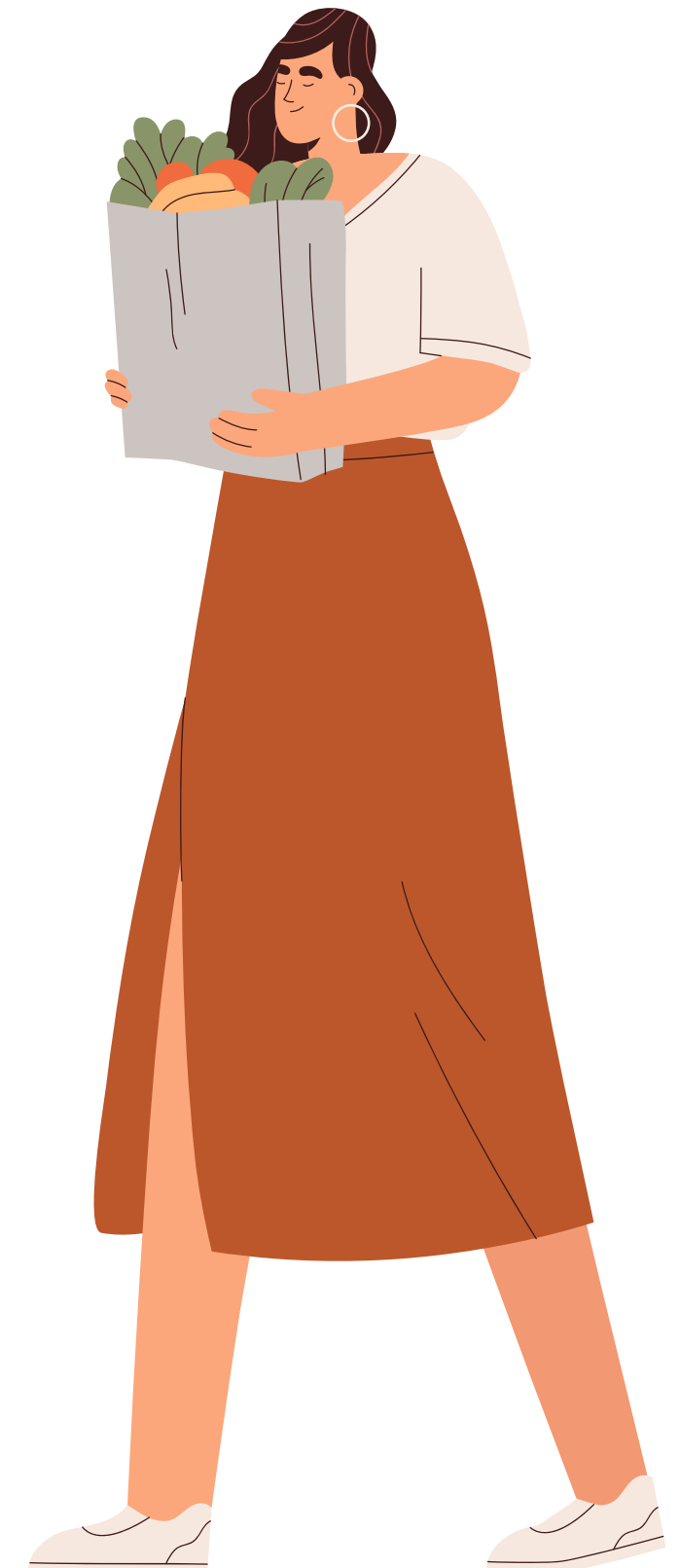

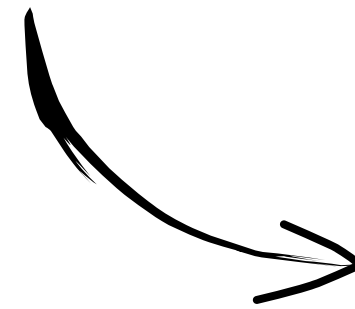
