FIRST CONDITIONAL

It's used to talk about things which may happen in the future.

All conditional sentences have two parts: the **'if clause'** and the **'main clause'**. It doesn't matter which clause comes first, but when the 'if clause' comes first, we should put a comma after it.

Affirmative

if clause If + present simple, will + infinitive. *main clause*

- I **will relax** at home If I **finish** my work early.
- I **'ll cook** something healthy if I find a good recipe.
- If I **wake up** early enough tomorrow, I **will attend** a fitness class.

Interrogative

main clause Will + infinitive If + present simple? *if clause*

- **Will** we **go** out for dinner If it **doesn't rain**?
- **Will** you **complete** a project today if I **help** you?
- **Will** Sarah **go** to the concert if John **invites** her?

Negative

if clause If + present simple, will / won't + infinitive. *main clause*

- If the tickets **aren't** sold out, we **'ll go** to a concert.
- If I **'m** busy with other tasks, I **won't practice** new skills.
- If they **have** other plans, we **won't spend** time together.

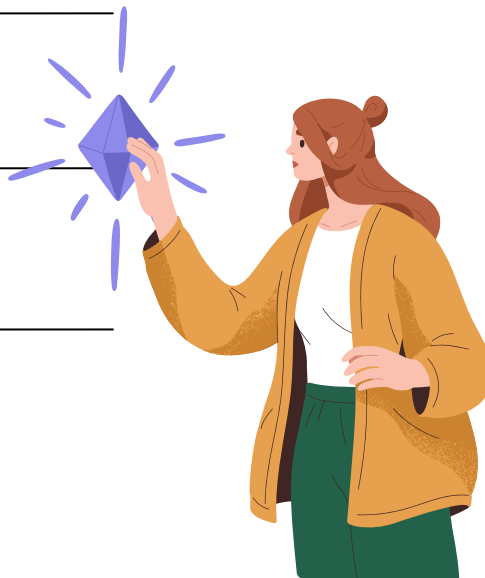

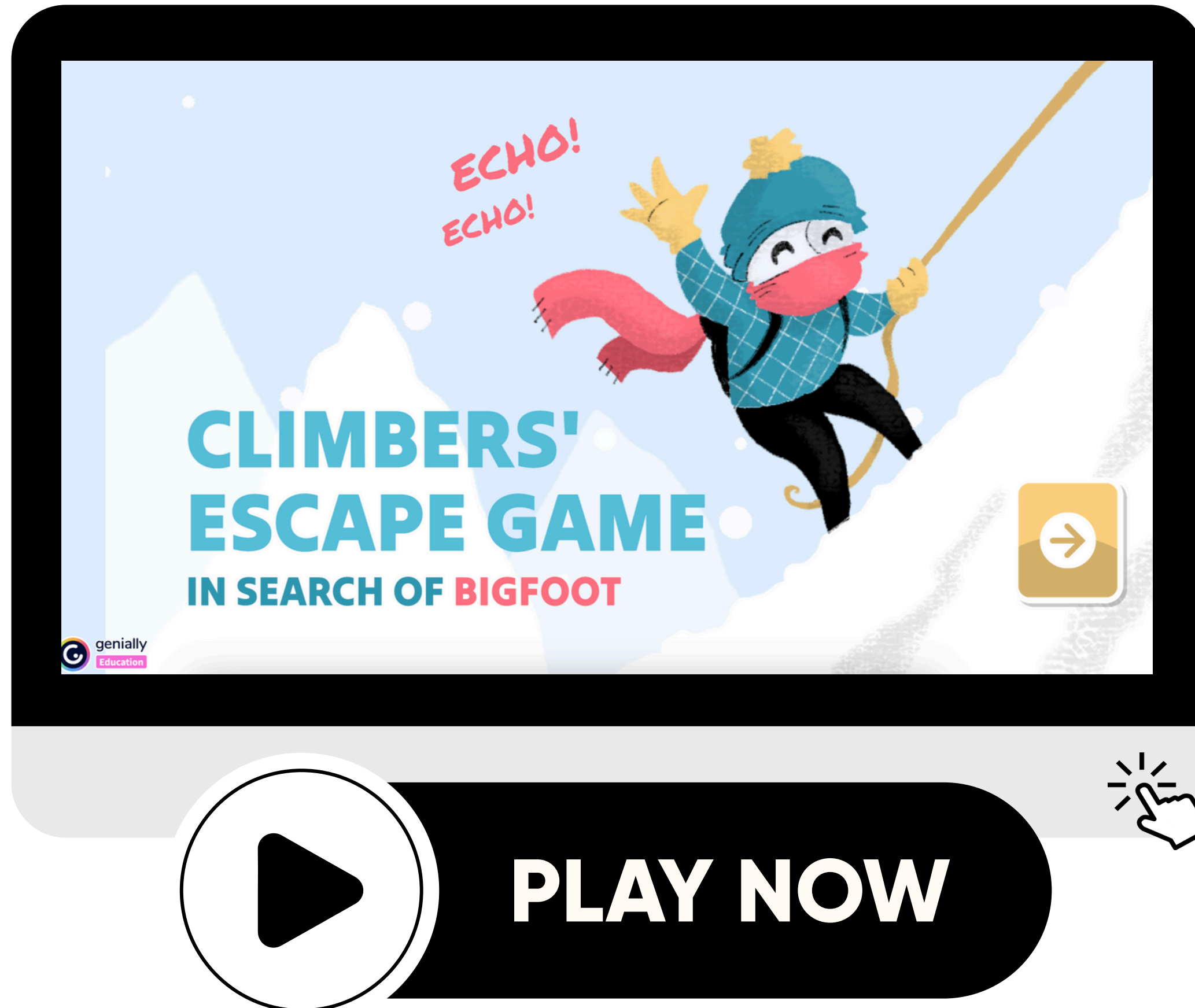
Alex: Wow, I hadn't thought of all that. Maybe we can plan it for another day then.
